AMP Transition to Practice Mentorship Program

Program Description

The transition from combined residency training to practice is a crucial time for the combined trained physician. Graduating residents often have specific goals for how they want to practice, struggle with finding ways to practice in an integrated manner, and lack like-minded mentors. As residents move away from the institution they trained in it is also easy to become disconnected from the greater community of combined trained physicians after graduation.

The Association of Medicine and Psychiatry has developed a unique three-year mentorship program for residents in their final year of training to help them transition into practice. This mentorship program will provide the graduating resident/early career physician (ECP) with mentorship support and help them remain connected to other combined-trained physicians.

General Information

- The AMP Transition to Practice mentorship program may last up to three years.
 - Enrollment in this program can occur in the PGY5 year ECP 1, or ECP 2 year.
 - This program is available to AMP members who are combined trained physicians in their PGY5 year or in their 1st or 2nd year post-graduation (from residency or fellowship). Training may be either through a combined trained residency or sequential training (e.g. Internal Medicine residency followed by Psychiatry residency).
 - Mentors are members of the AMP Executive Committee. There are NO financial obligations for the mentor in this process.
 - At this time this program is not being offered to non-physicians, non-combined trained practitioners, and non-AMP members. To become a member <<[Click Here](#)>>.
